MINNESOTA LYNX vs. SEATTLE STORM

GAME HIGHLIGHTS

- The Storm started with a stellar first quarter on Sunday, outscoring Minnesota 24-19 with rookie forward Breanna Stewart leading the way with nine points.
- The Lynx went on a 9-0 run early in the second quarter behind Maya Moore, who didn't take a shot in the first quarter but exploded for 10 in the second. Moore scored seven points in a two-minute span to help Minnesota build a narrow lead that it would hold onto for the rest of the night.

KEY STAT OF THE GAME

- Minnesota won the rebounding battle (38-34) and turnover battle (11 for the Lynx, 15 for Seattle), which helped make the difference in what was a close game throughout.

STORM HIGHLIGHTS

- Alysha Clark scored a game-high 20 points on 7-of-13 shooting, posting a new career-high. She also pulled down 7 rebounds, two shy of her career-high. Clark had struggled in the first two games, scoring four combined points on 0-of-5 shooting.
- Breanna Stewart recorded her second-straight double-double with 14 points and 13 rebounds. She has now twice tied Lauren Jackson's franchise rookie record of 13 rebounds in a single game.
- Sue Bird finished one assist shy of a double-double, with 12 points and 9 assists. She also shot 50.0% from the floor, going 6-of-12 on the night.
- Jewell Loyd finished with 14 points for the Storm. Sunday's game marked the second straight contest that four Seattle players reached double figures.
- The Storm held the Lynx to their lowest scoring output of the season, as they had put up 97 and 95 points in their first two games.

LYNX HIGHLIGHTS

- Maya Moore led the Lynx in scoring with 17 points on 7-of-15 shooting. She was one rebound shy of a double-double, finishing with 9.
- Lindsay Whalen led the way in the fourth quarter with seven points, and she finished with 14 points on 5-of-11 shooting.
- Sylvia Fowles had an outstanding first quarter with seven points on 3-of-4 shooting, going on to record 15 points and eight rebounds.

NEXT GAME: Seattle has two more home games this week, starting with a Thursday night matchup with the Washington Mystics. The Storm then hosts the Connecticut Sun on Saturday, with both games tipping off at 7 p.m. PT.
