GAME HIGHLIGHTS

- Trailing by 16 with 3:24 to go in the third quarter, Seattle marched back into the game behind Sue Bird, who notched 11 of her 15 points in the second half. Bird found Jewell Loyd under the hoop for the game-tying layup with seven seconds to go that sent it to overtime.
- Washington initially built its lead through a 12-0 run spanning the end of the first quarter and the beginning of the second, and the Mystics used an 11-2 run to increase their lead to 16 late in the third quarter.

KEY STAT OF THE GAME

• After missing Washington's first four games while recovering from knee surgery, Ivory Latta provided a spark off the bench for the Mystics, scoring 16 points on 5-of-8 shooting. Latta hit a crucial three-pointer with 44 seconds remaining in overtime to give Washington a four-point lead.

STORM HIGHLIGHTS

- Breanna Stewart led the Storm with a career and game-high 25 points on 10-of-20 shooting.
- Breanna Stewart recorded 4 steals in tonight's match up. She was 1 shy of Lauren Jackson's rookie franchise record of 5, during her 2001 campaign.
- In her 2016 debut, Jenna O'Hea was 2-of-3 for the night. Her first touch of the night was a catch-and-shoot three with 47 seconds left in the first quarter to cut the Mystics lead to one, 18-19. Seattle finished the quarter trailing 18-22.
- Breanna Stewart connected on a career-high 3 three-pointers for the night, topping her previous high of 2, 5/20/16 at Phoenix.

MYSTICS HIGHLIGHTS

- Emma Meesseman led the Mystics with 19 points on 9-of-15 shooting. Her 9 FGM ties her season-high and her 15 FGA ties the Mystics' season high.
- Emma Meesseman pulled down a game-high 13 rebounds, which ties her career-high mark, something she's now done 4 times.
- Tayler Hill scored 18 points. She is leading the Mystics in scoring this season at 18.0 points per game.
- Washington had 38 rebounds compared to Seattle's 27. Seattle is now 0-2 when outrebounded by the opponent.

NEXT GAME: Seattle next hosts the Connecticut Sun on Saturday at 7 p.m. before heading back on the road to face the Indiana Fever next Wednesday.
