SEATTLE STORM at DALLAS WINGS COLLEGE PARK CENTER | JUNE 16, 2016

GAME HIGHLIGHTS

- Seattle fell in the franchise's first trip to Dallas, and the first meeting between the two teams in 2016, 79-88.
- Breanna Stewart shot 8-of-11 (72.7%) from the floor en route to 29 points, setting a new career-high and marking the fourth time in her young career that she's topped the 20-point plateau. She knocked down her first three-pointer in five games (0-16 over the last four contests). The last time Stewart connected from deep was June 3 vs. Phoenix, where Seattle won, 95-81. The first-year forward had 17 of her 29 points in the first half.

KEY STAT OF THE GAME

• Dallas outscored Seattle 31-19 in the third quarter, the highest scoring total Seattle has allowed in any third quarter period this season. Dallas connected on 73.3% of shots in the frame, (11-of-15).

STORM HIGHLIGHTS

- Breanna Stewart shot 8-of-11 (72.7%) from the floor en route to 29 points, setting a new career-high and marking the fourth time in her young career that she's topped the 20-point plateau. She knocked down her first three-pointer in five games (0-16 over the last four contests). The last time Stewart connected from deep was June 3 vs. Phoenix, where Seattle won, 95-81. The first-year forward had 17 of her 29 points in the first half.
- Breanna Stewart recorded a career-high-tying 4 blocks, the fifth time she's recorded three or more rejections this season.
- Crystal Langhorne scored 16 points on 7-of-10 shooting, two points shy of her season-high. She also grabbed seven rebounds, one shy of her season-high.
- Sue Bird finished with 11 points, marking her 40th-consecutive game that she's scored, spanning multiple seasons, (8/15/14 at Los Angeles).
- Alysha Clark (2 points tonight), Jewell Loyd (12 points tonight), Sue Bird (11 points tonight) and Breanna Stewart (29 points tonight) are the remaining Seattle players who have scored in every game they have played in 2016.
- All five Seattle starters scored in tonight's contest, which marks the 11th time this season (out of 12 games) that the starting unit has achieved that feat.
