SEATTLE STORM vs. NEW YORK LIBERTY

GAME HIGHLIGHTS

- The Seattle Storm was defeated by the New York Liberty in a back-and-forth 86-78 battle.

KEY STAT OF THE GAME

- New York rattled off an 11-2 run early in the third quarter behind two baskets apiece from Swin Cash and Sugar Rodgers en route to outscoring Seattle 26-13 in the frame and taking a 14-point lead, 72-58, into the fourth quarter. New York's largest lead of 17 came with 3:14 to play in the third, up 68-51.

STORM HIGHLIGHTS

- Alysha Clark marked a career-high 23-points going 7-of-7 from the floor and hitting 7-of-8 free throws. Clark tallied her 100th career free throw on the night.
- Ramu Tokashiki scored a season-high 15-points, shooting 75 percent on the floor (previously 7 vs. on 5/28), which is also a team-high off the bench for the season.
- Breanna Stewart pulled down a career-high 17 rebounds, toppling the previous rookie record ([13, Lauren Jackson, 7/27/01, vs. Phoenix] and Stewart [13, 2 times]) and setting a new 2016 league-wide single-game high.
- Sue Bird had her first double-double of 2016 and 21st of her career with 13 points and 10 assists. Her 10 assists are her season-high and a team-high for the Storm.
- The Storm tallied a season-high points scored off the bench with 21 (19 vs. Indiana on 6/1).
- Seattle distributed 23 assists on 28 field goals made. The Storm's 23 assists are the most the Liberty has allowed in their season.
- The Storm's 8 turnovers were a low for the season (previously 10 vs. Phoenix 6/3).

LIBERTY HIGHLIGHTS

- Tina Charles recorded her 6th double-double of the season with a team-high 19 points and 13 rebounds. Charles' 13 rebounds equaled a season-high by a Storm opposing player.
- The Liberty tallied a season-high 35 field goals on the night. (34 vs. Indiana on 6/3).
- Tonight's win extends New York's seven-game win streak against Seattle.

NEXT GAME: Seattle will open its first multi-city road trip from June 7-18, opening with the Connecticut Sun on June 10 at 4:00 p.m. PT. The team will stop in Indiana, San Antonio and Dallas before returning to KeyArena on June 19 at 4:00 p.m. to face Minnesota.
