INDIANA FEVER vs. SEATTLE STORM

GAME HIGHLIGHTS

- Breanna Stewart led Seattle with 32 points and 11 rebounds. She has now reached double-digit scoring in 10-consecutive games, 18 times this season. Tonight's effort was also her second 20-point, 10-rebound game of the season.
- The Fever and Storm combined to hit 20 three-pointers in the game.

KEY STAT OF THE GAME: TALE OF THE QUARTERS

- After being outscored 25-18 in the first quarter, Seattle roared back in the second quarter, outscoring the Fever 32-19. The Seattle bench scored 14 points in the half, with 8 coming from Kaleena Mosqueda-Lewis.
- In the third quarter, Indiana responded, scoring 25 points while holding Seattle to just 16 to take a 69-66 lead into the final frame.

STORM HIGHLIGHTS

- Breanna Stewart led Seattle with 32 points and 11 rebounds. She has now reached double-digit scoring in 10-consecutive games, 18 times this season. Tonight's effort was also her second 20-point, 10-rebound game of the season.
- Breanna Stewart's 30-point effort is the fourth time in 2016 that a Storm player has eclipsed the mark this season. (Stewart, 38 points, 6/28 vs. Atlanta; Jewell Loyd, 30 points, 5/20 at Phoenix; Jewell Loyd, 32 points, 6/3 vs. Phoenix). The pair joins Sue Bird and Lauren Jackson as the only players in Storm history to record multiple 30-point outputs in a single game.
- Breanna Stewart recorded 12 points solely from the 3-point arc. She connected on 4-of-5 from distance, for a career-high 80.0% percent three-point field goal efficiency.
- All five of the Storm starters scored tonight, led by Breanna Stewart's 32 points. Seattle's starting five have scored in every game this season except one, (5/22 vs. Minnesota).
- Despite the final score, Seattle outscored Indiana in the paint 28-24, for the fourth time this season.

FEVER HIGHLIGHTS

- Shenise Johnson scored a career-high five 3-point field goals, finishing with a season-high 18 points.
- Indiana placed six players in double-digit scoring. Johnson had 18, Tamika Catchings finished with 15, Lynetta Kizer and Devereaux Peters had 12. Tiffany Mitchell scored 11 and Lynetta Kizer chipped in 10.
- Indiana's bench contributed three double-figure scorers in Johnson, Peters and Mitchell. The Indiana bench outscored the Storm's bench 41-18.
- The Fever concluded a three-game Western Conference road trip and a month-long stretch with eight of 10 games played on the road Sunday in Seattle.
- Indiana won for the second time in three nights to cap its West Coast road trip, and handed the Storm their fourth loss in five games.

NEXT GAME: Seattle welcomes the Washington Mystics on Friday, July 15 at 7 p.m. The game will mark the franchise's retirement ceremony for former Storm center Lauren Jackson.
