- Seattle's starting five have scored in every game this season except one, (5/22 vs. Minnesota), and it took just 8:02 into tonight's contest for the unit to do just that. Crystal Langhorne had a team-high 6 in the opening frame.

- Sue Bird (3 points tonight), Alysha Clark (11), Jewell Loyd (15) and Breanna Stewart (21) have scored in every single Storm game this season.
