LOS ANGELES SPARKS vs. SEATTLE STORM

GAME HIGHLIGHTS

- Crystal Langhorne tallied her first double-double this season with 16 points and 10 rebounds. Tonight ties her season-high rebounds (10 vs. San Antonio 7/20/16).
- After facing Los Angeles to open the season and falling 66-96 in Hollywood, Seattle never trailed tonight and beat the Sparks to take a 1-1 series tie. The two teams will face off on Sept. 11 in Seattle.

KEY STAT OF THE GAME:

- Seattle led the Los Angeles the entire duration of play and held the Sparks to only 28 points in the first half which was their lowest scoring half of the season.

STORM HIGHLIGHTS

- Tonight marks Seattle's tenth win this season, equaling last year's final wins with nine games left to play.
- Breanna Stewart led the team in rebounds with 11, 10 of which were defensive. She now leads the league in defensive rebounds for the season with 205, at 8.2 per game.
- Sue Bird marked a season-high from the 3-point line, going 5-for-7 from deep (previously 4, 4 times).
- Crystal Langhorne tallied her first double-double this season with 16 points and 10 rebounds. Tonight ties her season-high rebounds (10 vs. San Antonio 7/20/16).
- Alysha Clark's 8 rebounds marked as season-high (7 vs. Minnesota 5/22/16) and fell just one short of her career-high (9 vs. Phoenix 6/21/15).
- The Storm tied the season-high for steals for a third time tonight, posting 10. Jewell Loyd snagged 5 of those, marking a career-high (3, 2 times).

SPARKS HIGHLIGHTS

- Los Angeles held Seattle to 9 points in the second quarter, the second-lowest second quarter scoring for the Storm this season (7 vs. San Antonio 7/20/16).
- Nneka Ogumike led for the Sparks, scoring 28 points on 11-of-15 shooting, 73.3 percent. Tonight marks her tenth consecutive double-digit scoring campaign.
- The Sparks outrebounded the Storm, 36-34, led in shooting percentage, 45.5-43.9 as well as points in the paint, 36-28.
